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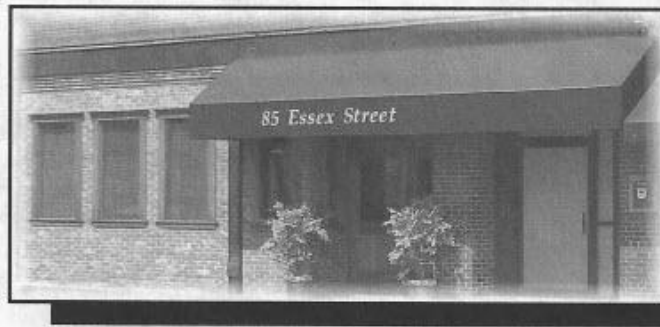

Joyce Angela Jellison was born in Philadelphia, PA and is an award-winning journalist, artist, writer, poet and former law professor at Bunker Hill College. She attended Pennsylvania State University, The Art Institute of Philadelphia, Urban College of Boston, Bay Path College and is a graduate of the Massachusetts School of Law where she holds a Juris Doctorate in Law.

In 1999 she won the North Carolina Press Association Award for New Enterprise Journalism for her stories about life in prison and an Associated Press Citation for her work during the criminal trial of Robert Frederick Glass, a man convicted of murdering Sharon Lopatka.

Her abstract artwork was featured at the Melrose Ballroom in New York on October 19, 2016.

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### Daniel M. Kimmel (corrected biography)

Daniel is no stranger to being in the public light. His movie reviews appeared in the *Worcester Telegram and Gazette* for 25 years. Now they can be found online at [northshoremovies.net](http://northshoremovies.net). For seven years he was also known as the "Movie Maven" for *The Jewish Advocate*. Later he served as its editor.

His book on the history of FOX TV, [The Fourth Network](#), received the Cable Center Book Award. His other books include a history of DreamWorks, [The Dream Team](#); [I'll Have What She's Having: Behind the Scenes of the Great Romantic Comedies](#); and [Jar Jar Binks Must Die... and other observations about science fiction movies](#), which was nominated for a Hugo Award for "Best Related Work."

Daniel's first novel, [Shh! It's a Secret: a novel about Aliens, Hollywood, and the Bartender's Guide](#), was a finalist for the Compton Crook Award. He is a past president of the Boston Society of Film Critics and past co-chair of the Boston Online Film Critics Association. He has taught at Emerson College and Suffolk University, lectures on film to a variety of groups, and served as emcee for the New England Region of the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs.

Once the pictures were developed, they engaged in exploring the theme by using both writing and art as tools of self-reflection and inquiry.

The final art products were showcased at El Taller, a local literacy and cultural hub for the Lawrence community. The young people shared not only their creative work but also what

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this experience meant for them. Their voices enhanced the beauty of Lawrence, lifting the negative stereotype that long defined the city. The project acts as a reminder to everyone that hope, growth, and change are seeded in our youth.
